

Digital Safety Terms



A definition

When you start using social media and the Internet, you will realise there is a specific vocabulary to learn. The lingo is very useful to know if you want to be up to date. However, digital safety terms are also really helpful in avoiding any pitfalls.



Why is this important?

When you click on a link and a little pop-up message on your screen asks if you accept the cookies, you tend to say yes but don't know what we are discussing. When you accept the cookies, you give information on your online presence and actions. It is not dangerous for you, but it can be intrusive for you. Your information can be used to influence you through targeted advertising, for instance.

Tips and tricks

- To learn as much vocabulary as possible and not be lost, you can spot all the words you don't know or understand and search for them on <u>this glossary</u> from internetmatters.org or <u>this one</u> from internetsafety101.org which is more focused on safety terms.
- Don't assume you know a term when unsure of its meaning. Some words could mean something offline, but their meaning online is not the same. Always check the definition.
- Sometimes, some definitions will not be enough to really understand the impact on your safety on social media and the Internet. Then you can search for more information.
