



How to talk to your child about social media

A definition

If we want our children to be safe on social networks, the best way is to talk to them about social media, including positive aspects and potential pitfalls.



Why is this important?

<u>Eurostat</u> stated that in 2021, in 14 EU States, 9 out of 10 young people used social media, while a further 10 Member States reported that 80-89 % of youth participated in these kinds of networking activities.

Tips and tricks

- It is very likely that children know more than you on social media, as they are more exposed to new trends that you do not know. Talking with them will help you discover these new social networks and be aware of the platforms they are in.
- Don't forget to have a positive approach: there are many advantages to social media.
 Don't act as an enemy of social media; otherwise, they won't follow your suggestions.
