## A definition

Whether online or in real life, there are rules one needs to follow in order to conduct discussions, conversations, debates and interactions properly.



## Why is this important?

Following such rules can prevent adverse consequences and protect users from social backlash, cyberbullying, unethical communication, unsafe conduct, sharing of confidential data and cyber-security issues for individuals, communities and organisations.



## Tips and tricks

- ➔ Read and respect the terms and conditions of the platform you are using.
- ➔ Remain respectful, factual and ethical. Avoid combative behaviour and hate speech.
- ➔ Think of the consequences of your posts, words and behaviours on yourself and others. Remember that out of context or out of your close friend group, what you may have meant as a harmless joke might be perceived as derogatory or offensive to others.
